Welcome to Year One

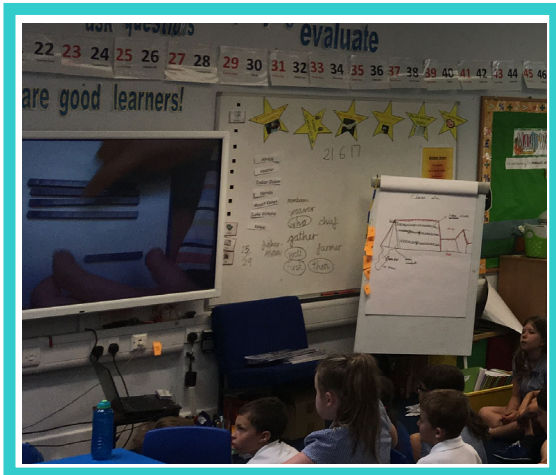
At lunchtime...

READING

Children will independently change their reading books, every day if they need to. When they have finished their reading book either at school or at home they will return it and choose a new one that they like the look of.

Children should read for 10 minutes each night at home with you and you should leave a comment about how they got on in their reading record.

HOMEWORK

Learning tasks are posted in Google Classrooms every Friday at 3pm and should be completed by 9am on Wednesday mornings. You will receive login details from the school office in due course. There will be tasks in maths and phonics and these will be differentiated to suit each learner's needs.

SPARE CLOTHES


Please send in a named bag with a spare set of clothes and underwear. We need them in case of toilet accidents or wet outdoor play. Children will keep these in a small bag on their peg.
