




WHERE IS UFTON COURT?



Ufton Court: an overview

- A timber-framed Tudor house incorporating an earlier medieval manor house.
- A magnificent Tithe Barn and range of outbuildings.
- Set in 16 acres of beautiful grounds, surrounded by private woodland.



A Brief History of Ufton Court

- → A Grade 1 Listed Tudor building, with parts dating back to the 15th Century.
- Initially owned by the Lovell family, the main owners were the Catholic Perkins family who were responsible for the many Tudor characteristics present today.
- Ufton Court has now passed from LEA management to become an independent registered charity, the Ufton Court Educational Trust.

Facilities

- 8 dormitory bedrooms
- 4 staff bedrooms
- Separate dining rooms
- 3 teaching rooms including the Great Hall
- The Tithe Barn for evening banquets
- 16 acres of beautiful gardens and grounds giving ample space for games and outside activities



Dining facilities

- Fully catered 3 meals daily.
- Nutritious home cooked food.
- Special diets catered for if notified in advance.
- Cake provided for birthday children.





Bedrooms

- Eight dormitory bedrooms sleep 3-10
- 4 Staff bedrooms adjacent.
 Night lights in rooms and corridors.
- All bedding provided.





Health and Safety

- All Ufton staff are DBS checked and trained.
- Children are given a safety briefing on arrival.
- Activities are all risk assessed.
- All activities take place on site.
- Members of staff attending are experienced in residential trips and have visited Ufton before.

Security

- The Ufton Court Site Manager is resident on site, and is on 24 hour callout duty.
- Staff bedrooms and Site Manager's house are connected by internal phone.
- Each school group has exclusive residential use of Ufton Court.
- All bedrooms (except one) are on the first floor.
- Dim nightlights are switched on in bedrooms and corridors at night.
- Staff bedrooms are adjacent/close to children's rooms.

Children's Kit list

- Important items:
- Suitable waterproof
- Wellies/boots + indoor trainers/shoes
- Gloves/hats
- Black tights + shoes for banquet girls AND boys
- Medication labelled
- Teddy!



Useful tips

- Make sure all articles are named.
- Do not bring valuable items, mobile phones, or money.
- Ensure your child's bag is not too big/heavy. Try to avoid suitcases on wheels hard to get over the gravel and up stairs!
- Remember indoor shoes (with grip, NOT smooth soles,) and boots/wellies. Pack indoor shoes at the top of the bag!
- Bring suitable clothing not 'best'.
- Spare carrier bags are useful for taking home muddy shoes/boots.
- No food items please, unless by arrangement for special diets, which should be notified well in advance of visit.

What happens next?

- Teaching staff will allocate groups of children to dormitories and activity groups.
- Behaviour expectations are made clear to the children before we go.

Things to Do

- Complete medical information on Parent App.
- Make any final payments.
- Talk to your child about behaviour expectations / anxieties.
