



Phonics and Reading

At John Rankin, we follow the ELS phonics scheme. A new sound is introduced each day, followed by a review and an opportunity to apply new skills.


The children also learn 'harder to read and spell' words. These can not be phonetically decoded and therefore, are sight read.

Reading is completed in groups at school but should also take place <u>daily</u> at home.

Drawing Club

Maths

• We follow



- The aim of maths is to develop fluency and deep number sense
- The children will become factually fluent in numbers 1-10 over the year. You may think we are moving slowly, but the aim is to build a really secure foundation for Primary School maths
- Children will learn to subitise with speed and reasoning. They will learn to take apart numbers (subtraction) and put number back together (addition)
- Children will learn number facts and reasoning without the need to count e.g. 2 is made of 1 and 1
- We aim to transform the way we think and teach maths

Discovery Time

Much of your child's day is spent in Discovery Time. This is child-led and allows the children to explore and engage across a variety of activities.

During this time, adults facilitate and engage in meaningful thinking and conversations with the children to encourage new vocabulary, support reasoning and develop problem-solving skills.

Forest School

Wednesdays – Every Week

Children will follow a range of activities. Forest school is child led. Whilst we will offer an activity each week, it will be up to the child to choose to join in the making. Some children far prefer to explore their own imagination in the forest.

We aim to do a cooking session every half term

Children will be introduced to a range of small tools too.

Please expect MUD! And be prepared for rain. Wind and thunder/ lightening is the only things to affect us going to the forest

We will send waterproofs home in half terms for washing, unless needed before...
