Printmaking:

Printmaking is a process in art. A design, usually a picture or words, is made on a surface and then copied or printed onto another surface.

History of Printing:

Printmaking dates all the way back to the Stone Age! It was developed in China from 100AD when paper was invented. The Bible was the first book to be printed. Today, it is used all around us—to create our clothes, books and in art.

Techniques:

Printmaking uses a range of techniques including relief (block) printing, monoprinting and etching. Each technique gives a slightly different artistic impression.

Printing	An artistic process where a design is made on a surface
Matrix	The first surface that is used when creating a print
Relief	A technique that allows a print to be repeated by creating a design on a surface and then stamping that onto paper
Monoprint	A technique where a print can only be produced once
Palette	The range of colours used in a particular artwork
Contrast	The difference between shades or tints that makes elements in artwork stand out
Proportion	The relationship in size between one thing and another
