- People lived in settlements and many were farmers.
- Metals making was introduced to Britain in the Bronze Age.

Bronze Age: People developed the technology to make bronze which they used for tools, containers and jewellery. People arrived from Europe to live in Britain, called the Beaker people, they brought with them bell shaped pottery called

Iron Age: People developed tools and weapons out of Iron. Hillforts developed during the Iron Age, people built their settlements on a hill for protection from other tribes.

Stonehenge: Stonehenge is a historic site and monument that was started in the New Stone Age but was thought to be completed during the Bronze Age.
