Artists who create furniture are often called **craftspeople** or **designers**. Furniture is more than just **practical** - designers and craftspeople produce furniture which reflects the **era or culture** it is made in, or the **personality** of the maker. As artists, we can use a variety of materials to design and make our own model chairs. The chairs we make can reflect our personality, and be enjoyed by others.

Yinka Ilori is a multidisciplinary artist and designer with a bold bright visual language influenced by his British-Nigerian heritage. Three components that feature heavily in Yinka's work are pattern, colour and storytelling. Yinka uses his crafts as a way to communicate Nigerian parables and verbal traditions. His work is described as a fusion between contemporary design and Nigerian tradition.
