School Uniform



Our school uniform imbues children with a sense of pride and belonging. The school colours are royal blue and grey and the school logo was designed by our pupils. All children are expected to wear school uniform and we are grateful for your ongoing support in this matter.

Boys wear grey shorts or in cold weather, long trousers, a white polo shirt and at the Juniors, a shirt, optional tie and sweatshirt. Shoes should be black and grey socks

Girls wear grey skirts, smart trousers or pinafore dresses with a white polo shirt and at the Juniors a shirt, optional tie and sweatshirt or cardigan. Shoes should be black and socks/tights grey or white. Girls may wear blue and white checked dresses in the summer.

We suggest that all children have a change of clothes, in case of needing to change following OPAL playtimes.

Forest School All children will need wellies and waterproof coat and trousers for taking part in Forest School

We recommend that children bring a book bag or rucksack to school. These are helpful for transporting books and school work to and from school.

All school uniform with a logo on it can be purchased from Skoolkit, which is situated in Parkway in Newbury town centre. Alternatively, you can order from their website skoolkit.co.uk

All other uniform without a logo can be purchased from supermarkets or other school uniform suppliers at a reasonable cost.

Please make sure that all of your child's school clothing, including coat and outdoor clothing, is **clearly named**. This enables us to reunite items of 'Lost Property' with their owners!

P.E. Children require a pair of navy shorts, a white t-shirt and a pair of trainers for outdoor P.E.

In FS2 where children are working towards their 'Managing Self' Early Learning Goal, they will bring P.E kit into school and change in the classroom. From Year 1 onwards, your child will wear their P.E. kit to school on their P.E day.

Jewellery The only jewellery to be worn is a watch. No bracelets, ankle bracelets, rings etc. are allowed. Earrings should be studs which will have to be removed or taped over for P.E./Games. Please provide micropore tape which can be kept in your child's school bag. Makeup, dyed hair, 'extreme' haircuts, nail varnish and braids are **not** part of the school uniform and are not permitted.

Travel to school

We encourage all children to walk, scoot or cycle to school wherever possible. If you do need to drive your child to and from school, please park responsibly and respectfully in the surrounding roads and switch your engine off. The car park is strictly for school staff and Blue Badge holders.

If you have a medical condition which requires you to park in the car park, please ask for a parking permit application form from the office. We appreciate your co-operation.



Collection

If your child is being collected by someone other than yourself, please inform the school by calling 01635 42376. We will give you a one-time password to share with the adult collecting your child. We will not release your child to another adult unless that person has the one-time password.

Other information

- ◇ For health and safety reasons, dogs are not allowed anywhere on the school site. Smoking is also prohibited onsite and within the vicinity of the school gates.
- ◇ For safeguarding reasons, mobile phones must not be used on the school site. This includes drop-off and when waiting to collect children at the end of the day.

Attendance

An exemplary attendance record gives your child the best opportunity for high attainment and contributes towards their future success. Your child must attend school every day unless there is an unavoidable cause.

Absence from school disrupts pupils' learning, disturbs routines and can create feelings of isolation from peers.

Every school day counts.

Arrive on time

The school gates open from 8.30am. If your child arrives after 8.50am, they have already missed some vital learning and check-in time. They will need to be brought via the Infant Reception to sign in.

What should I do if my child needs to be absent from school?

Either email the school at absence@jrs.w-berks.sch.uk or telephone the school office by 9.30am on each day of their absence, stating your child's name, class and the reason for their absence, so that we know your child is safe at home.

If your child has a cold, a cough or a headache, we would expect them to attend school. If your child suffers from a sickness/diarrhea bug, we request that they stay at home for a period of 48 hours from the last bout.

Please try to make any medical/dental appointments out of school time to avoid disrupting your child's learning.

Absence in term-time

We actively encourage parents to book family holidays out of term time so as not to disrupt their children's education. Permission for any planned absence from school must be sought from the Executive Headteacher, by completing an Absence Request Form. Only requests with '**exceptional circumstances**' such as attending a funeral of a close relative, will be authorised.

Our school has high standards of behaviour and we expect our pupils to demonstrate our three simple rules at all times. Children are encouraged to be respectful and sensitive to each other's needs and to care for personal and school property.

We adopt a trauma-informed, restorative approach to managing behaviour.

We aim to model and promote good behaviour at all times so that pupils can grow in self-control, self-esteem and self-confidence. We aim to:

- ensure children are clear about expectations.
- Provide children with stimulating well-planned and progressive learning opportunities.
- Encourage children to take responsibility for their own behaviour and to make conscious and positive choices.



Negative behaviour choices are dealt with by staff in a calm and timely manner. Children are given the opportunity to reflect on dysregulated behaviour choices. Children who have difficulty meeting the school's behavioural expectations are further supported by a member of the leadership team. Parents will be kept informed.

School Lunches

Dolce offers our children a broad variety of freshly-prepared delicious food at lunchtime.

Should your child wish to have a hot meal at school, you must order your child's lunch online. This can be done up until 8.50am on the day. Every child in the Infant school is entitled to receive a free school lunch. The cost of a meal at the Junior school is £2.63. If you are entitled to certain benefits, you may qualify for Free School Meals and should apply [here](#).

Children bringing packed lunches should place them in the cloakroom on arrival to school. Please note that glass bottles, fizzy drinks and nut products are not allowed in lunch boxes. We encourage children to have a healthy and balanced diet.

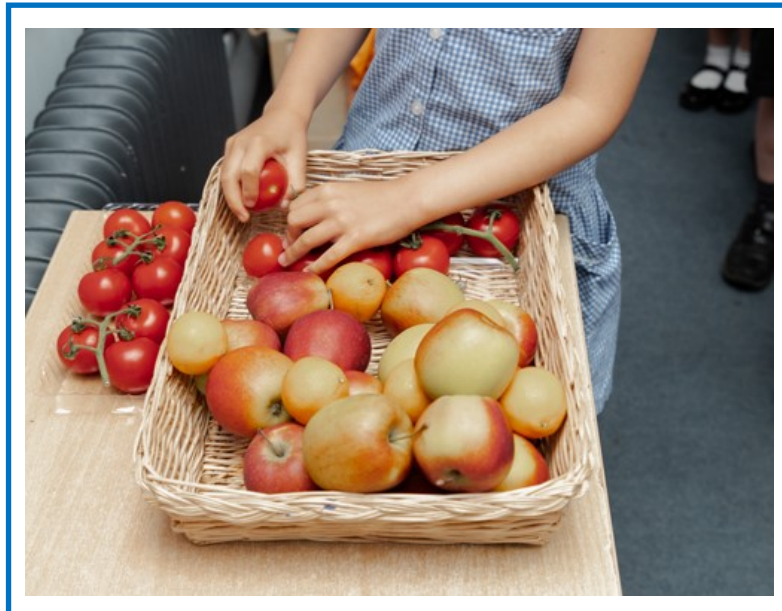
Snacks and Water

All children at the Infant school are provided with a fruit or vegetable snack as part of the Government School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme.

Junior school children are required to bring their own snack in for break time. This should ideally be a piece

of fruit or vegetable or other healthy snack.

Children are required to bring a drinks bottle containing **fresh water** every day. Should they forget their bottle, water will be available during the school day.



Milk

Every child under the age of five is entitled to free school milk. In our school, this milk is provided by Cool Milk, the UK's leading school milk supplier.

We will register your child for their free school milk on your behalf by providing Cool Milk with your child's name and date of birth. Please let us know if you do not want your child to be registered.

If you wish for your child to continue to receive milk after they turn 5, you can apply via the [Cool Milk website](#) to pay a subsidised rate for your child to continue. For children entitled to free school meals, this can be paid for by the school, however you must still apply for this provision.

School Trips



At John Rankin Schools, we are pleased to be able to offer many curriculum-enhancing trips and activities throughout the school year.

We work hard to keep costs to parents as low as possible. However, please bear in mind that with residential trips taking place in both Years 5 and 6, at least one trip in each of the preceding years, as well as swimming lessons, we would recommend that you save accordingly to ensure that your child can access these wonderful opportunities.

Our extracurricular trips and activities enrich the children's learning and our teaching staff work hard to ensure the children get the most from these experiences. We encourage all children to attend where possible to support and enhance their experiences in the classroom.

Safeguarding your child

We are committed to ensuring that all our children are well cared for, safe and protected. We have a detailed Safeguarding Policy, which looks at all aspects of safety throughout the school, but which also incorporates Child Protection. We follow West Berkshire's Child Protection procedures and work in collaboration with other agencies that support children and families. We are required to be watchful for signs and symptoms of physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse and neglect.

Pupil Wellbeing

Parents should be aware that where any incident of abuse is disclosed by a child, the school is obliged to discuss with/refer these to other agencies. There are designated persons within school with responsibility for the implementation of these procedures. Every member of staff, teaching and non-teaching, has been formally trained in Safeguarding and Child Protection.



Illness and Medicines

There may be occasions in which your child needs to receive medicine in school. Our First Aid-trained staff will be happy to administer this once a medical request form has been completed and returned to the office.

Regular medicines such as inhalers are held centrally in clearly marked containers and can be quickly and easily accessed by the pupil concerned.

It is the responsibility of the parent to check that any medicines held in school are in date.

There are many fully trained First Aiders within our staff. In the event of any concerns around your child's health and well-being, we will contact you immediately. We will not give any medication without your authorisation.



Forest School



At John Rankin Schools, we offer a broad and balanced curriculum to develop the whole child. Forest School enhances this work further with a range of experiences designed to develop the child holistically; physically, intellectually, emotionally, socially, spiritually and morally. We aim to challenge and support the children to become independent, resilient learners who enjoy trying out their ideas, working together with their peers to solve problems and conquering challenges in the natural world.

Communications

We keep our families up to date with school events and activities via email. Every Friday, a 'weekly reminders' email is sent for the coming week, to help you keep on top of school life.

Every half term we share with you, in the form of our newsletter, what our children have been learning across the school.

To ensure you receive all of our communications, please notify the school office if any of your contact details change so we can update our records.

We also have a Facebook and X (previously Twitter) account where we share news. Please search for John Rankin Schools.

Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium provides additional funding on top of the main funding a school receives. It is targeted at students from less advantaged backgrounds to help them benefit from the same opportunities as other students. The school receives £1320 per pupil (2018/2019) and uses this money to fund staff and resources targeted towards the needs children receiving the funding.

In addition to receiving the Pupil Premium funding, your child will also be entitled to free school meals. At the Infant school, all children receive a free school meal under the governments Universal Free School Meals Scheme. However this is a

considerable saving for parents of children in years 3 to 6, where school meals are charged at £2.63 per meal.

Who is eligible?

You can apply for Pupil Premium if you receive Universal Credit. If you think you may be eligible, please apply so the school will receive the Pupil Premium grant to provide extra support for your child.

Wrap-around Care

We offer Breakfast Club and After School Club provision from Monday to Friday, based in both the Infant and Junior school halls. Places are limited and we often hold a waiting list so it would be prudent to also explore alternative childcare options.

Breakfast club is open to all our Infant and Junior School children from 8am. It provides a stimulating start to the day with a wide variety of activities to engage children of all ages and abilities, and of course a variety of breakfast options.

This club costs £5.95 per session (subject to annual increase).

After School Club children are welcome to attend from FS2 up to Year 6. The clubs run from each of the school halls from the end of school day until 4.30pm (Half) or 6pm (Full). The costs per session are £7 for half (until 4.30pm) and £13.95 for full (until 6pm). The club includes healthy snacks and fun and engaging activities for all age groups.

Extra-curricular Activities

Our children benefit from a wide range of teacher, parent and outside agency led clubs. Some clubs will run every term and others will vary to provide a range of opportunities. You will receive full information on the clubs and always be told in advance if a club has to be cancelled for any reason.



We encourage children to take part and impress upon them that if they join an activity, it is a commitment which they have undertaken and should follow through with.

Getting Set Up

At John Rankin Schools, we use a number of third-party providers to provide services for our families, such as receiving communications, paying for school trips, ordering lunches, supplying milk, receiving progress updates and hosting parents' evenings. These companies have many benefits to improve the

efficiency of the school and make parent's lives easier. If you need any help with activating your accounts with our third party providers, please do contact the school office. Please read our 'Privacy Notice for School Pupils Policy' to understand how your child's data is protected.

John Rankin payments are made online with a credit or debit card via the Scopay. We will notify you when new items such as school trips or tickets for events are available for payment and consent on Scopay.

What you need to do now: Activate your Scopay account. It's quick and easy to do; simply follow the link on the activation email sent to you. Download the app: If you have a smartphone,

Please download Scopay from your app store (Android and iPhone). The



app shows the same information as the website PLUS it saves the school money when we send you a text message. OR Visit the website: <https://www.scopay.com/login> and click on 'Register as a New User' and follow the instructions.



In Nursery (FS1) and FS2 we capture, record and track your child's 'wow-moments' using Tapestry, an online observation and assessment tool, a system, which is hosted in the UK on

secure servers.

'These servers are proactively managed 24 hours a day. Each Tapestry account has its own database and the code itself is developed using hack resistant techniques. Filenames are encoded for uploaded videos and images, making Tapestry a safe and secure on-line Learning Journey tool'.

Frequently asked questions

What time is the school office open? What should I do if my child is late for school?

The school office is open from 8.30am to 4pm and staff will be pleased to deal with your enquiries. The office email is office@jrs.w-berks.sch.uk

Please call the office to let us know as soon as possible. If you arrive after 8:50am, please come via the Infant Reception to sign in.

What happens if my child has specific dietary requirements?

Please update your child's Dolce account with their allergens and this will ensure they are not able to select a meal containing these allergens.

Can I talk to my child's class teacher?

Absolutely. We encourage open communication between families and teachers. The mornings are generally a busy time as we welcome the children into school, therefore we recommend contacting the office to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet.

My child has a serious health problem, How will the school deal with this?

The school will work closely with you and the relevant health professionals involved with the you to draw up a care plan. The staff will also undertake any necessary training to enable them to care for your child during the school day.

What do I need to do if my child is taking medication?

You will need to complete a 'request to give medication' form downloaded from our school website and bring the medication to the school office. We can then administer medication for your child during the school day.



If I am running late to collect my child, what should I do?

Please call the school office as soon as possible. We will let your child's class teacher know and your child will then be brought to the Infant Reception to wait for you.

What should I do if my child is unwell?

Please email absence@jrs.w-berks.sch.uk or call the office and leave a message on our absence line by 9.30am, detailing your child's name, class and the nature of their illness.

What will happen if my child is ill at school?

We have First Aid trained staff on site, who will assess your child and contact you if necessary.

Can my child bring a mobile phone to school?

Pupils are NOT permitted to have a mobile phone in school. Should there be a need for them to have one on their journey to and from school, it must be given to their class teacher in the morning and will be returned at the end of the school day.

How do I make payments for school trips?

We use an online payment system called Scopay. Shortly after starting at John Rankin Schools, you will be sent an invitation email to register with Scopay. When a trip is planned, you will receive email notification from the school when it is visible on Scopay for payment.





How do I order school dinners?

To save the class teacher time in the mornings, all school dinners should be ordered at home via the School Grid website. This can be done up to 8.55am on the day.

How will my child with SEN experience school?

We have a strong SENCo team who will work closely with you and your child. You will be sent regular goals and updates and your child will have additional classroom support where necessary.

Where can I find lost property?

There are lost property bins in each school where all unnamed property is collected. The children are encouraged

to look for their own lost property during school time.

What should I do if someone else is collecting my child?

Please call the school office in advance to let us know of any changes to collection. You will be given a one-time password to share with the person collecting your child. This should be given to the class teacher on arrival at the classroom door.

What should I do if I have concerns about the school or a child?

Please talk to your child's class teacher initially. If you feel you can't talk to the teacher, contact the office to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet with a member of the Senior Leadership Team.



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
