Useful vocabulary

Rhythm—a strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound.

Beat— a regular and repeating pulse that starts the speed of *music*.

Compose—write or create (a work of art, especially music or poetry).

Improvise—create and perform (music, drama, or verse) spontaneously or without preparation.

Perform— carry out, accomplish, or fulfil (an action, task, or function).

Note—symbols that represents a musical sound

Posture—the position in which someone holds their body when standing or
