At lunchtime...

Children who have a school meal eat in the hall. Packed lunches can eat in the hall or outside, depending on the weather.

Assemblies.....



Our assemblies will take place in the Junior Hall.

At the end of the day, we leave through our classroom fire exit.



In Year 6, children may walk to the gate to meet family members, walk home alone or be collected from the playground.

Parents need to inform the School Office of any arrangements other than being collected from the playground.

When I come to school, I will wear school uniform...



I will need a waterproof coat in school. I may bring a change of footwear for break and lunch times and a change of clothes can be kept in a bag on my peg for changing after OPAL play if needed.

The only jewellery permitted is earrings and a watch. Earrings must be removed or covered with tape for PE.

Year Six Helpful Tips...

READING

I will independently change my reading book. We will have a designated library slot once a week. I will still be able to access the reading scheme if needed or choose a book from their classroom or library.

HOMEWORK

Homework will be sent home on a Friday, and needs to be returned the following Wednesday. Homework will include: spellings, a debate question, daily reading, times tables and a reading comprehension task. I am expected to record my daily reading in my reading diary.

SATs

I do not need to worry about SATs. SATs are just one way of assessing children at the end of Primary School. The staff will make sure we are as prepared as we can be. We will be sharing information about this via an evening presentation in the Autumn term for parents.

RESIDENTIAL

We will be discussing the residential in detail with parents at our, 'Meet the Teacher' session in September.



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
