When I come to school, I will come in through this door...

I will come to school between 8:35 and 8:50. My grown up will not be able to stay with me. They will drop me off and then leave. There will be adults from school there to help me.



I will keep my things here...

I will take as little as possible to and from school each day. I will only bring in the things I really need and leave what I can in school. My P.E. kit will be here for when I need to change on P.E. days.

This is my new classroom...

Our classroom might be set out a little bit differently to your old one. What do you think makes our new classroom special?



I will use these toilets...

When I go to the toilet, I will need to ask a grown up first. It is important that I try to go to the toilet during playtimes.





At playtimes...

We will use this area. If I have any problems at playtime, I can go to any of the adults who are outside. If I hurt myself, there will be a first aider who can help me. My playtime is at 10:50am.



At lunchtime...

I will eat my lunch either in the hall or outside, if the weather is nice. My lunchtime is at 12:15. For lunch, I can eat a school dinner or bring a packed lunch in from home. I need to wash my hands carefully before I eat.

Our assemblies will take place in the hall on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays.

When I go home, I will leave through this door...



My adult will collect me at 3:10 and we will need to leave the school grounds. I am not allowed to go on the adventure playground equipment or play football after school.

When I come to school, I will wear school uniform...



It is important that I am able to dress and undress myself. This includes being able to do up my own shoes for both the school day and P.E lessons. I will also be asked to keep wellington boots in school, and waterproofs for Forest School..

I also need the following clothes for Forest School, which will happen every other week. My clothes all need to be named.



I will need:

Waterproof trousers and top

Spare long sleeved t-shirt and trousers

Wellies

In winter:

Thick socks as a spare

Hat, gloves and scarf

Extra fleece/jumper

Year Two Helpful Tips...

READING

Children will independently change their reading books, every day if they need to. When they have finished their reading book either at school or at home they will return it and choose a new one that they like the look of.

Children should read for 10 minutes each night at home with you and you should leave a comment about how they got on in their reading record.

Homework will be sent home on a Friday and needs to be returned the following Wednesday. This will include a reading activity, phonics or spelling practice, debate questions, Maths fluency task and a library book to enjoy.

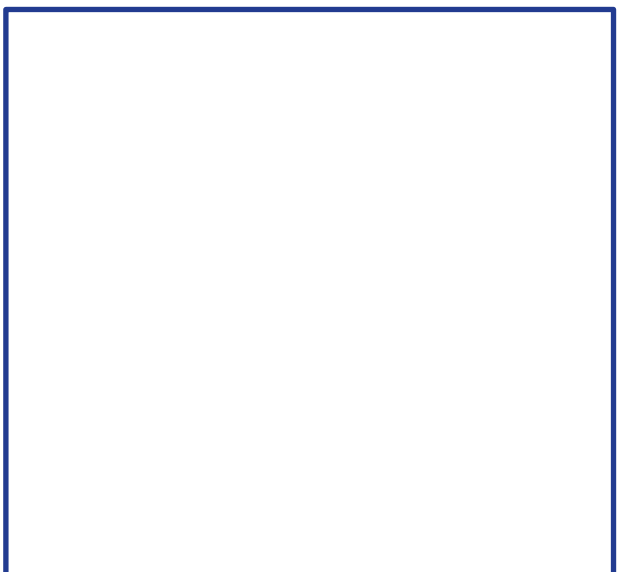
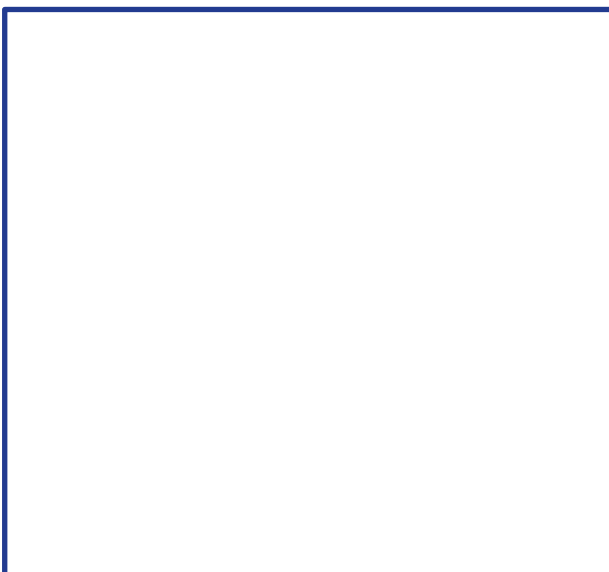
SPARE CLOTHES

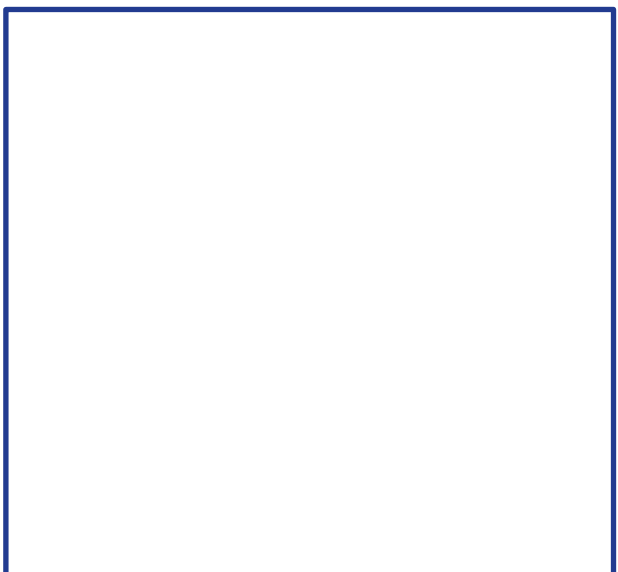
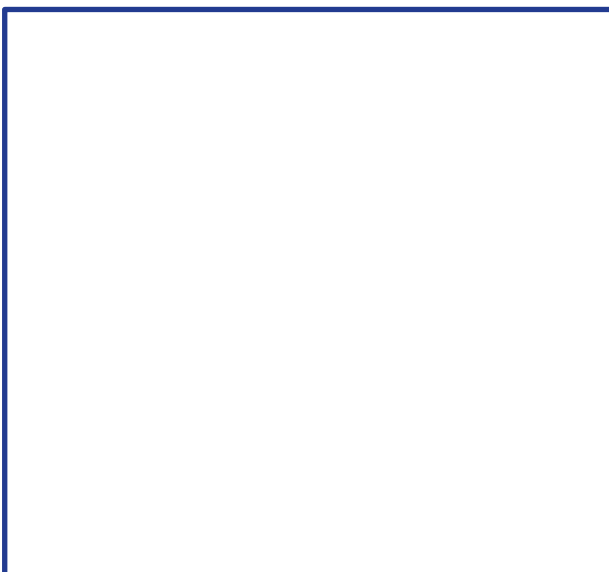
Please ensure all clothes and wellies are named.
